

College Park Enrichment Collaborative (CPEC) LOGIC MODEL for Program Evaluation

SITUATION:

Residents of the Banneker High School Feeder Area and College Park Opportunity Zone have limited access to culturally appropriate, systemic, and sustained enrichment services for youth and adults leading to jobs, medical homes and pathways out of poverty.

PRIORITIES:

1. Provide academic enrichment services to middle and high school students to reduce the dropout rate and to provide career and job readiness through CPEC Youth Club.
2. Link families of targeted College Park middle and high school students to medical homes, jobs, and enrichment services by creating the College Park People’s University (CPPU) with community and corporate support.
3. Provide College Park middle and high school students and their families with holistic academic and career enrichment opportunities linked to summer jobs in STEM and green technology fields.
